DEFINITIONS/ELIGIBILITY:

JR/YR – Riders are eligible to compete in these classes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. FEI JR Tests - only riders ages 14-18. FEI YR Tests - only riders ages 16-21. FEI Pony Tests - only riders ages 12-16. FEI Children Tests - only riders ages 12-14. Include birth date on entry.

AA – Adult Amateur – Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as AA from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 22. Only active USEF members may obtain amateur status.

PE – Para Equestrian – Riders must have a current USEF Dispensation Certificate which indicates their classification status to be eligible. All tests in standard arena.

CBLM – Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship qualifying class for 2025. Riders must be member of a participating GMO at the time of the show to be eligible.

USDF Q – Qualifying class for 2024 GAIG/USDF Regional Championships. Declare qualifying ride on entry form and pay additional \$15 qualifying fee prior to start of class.

Show management reserves the right to cut off entries prior to closing date if show is full. Entry packets for completed entries will be at stalls. Entry packets for completed entries for haul in horses will be on table outside of show office.

Guest Horses: (non-competing) Submit signed entry form, coggins, proof of vaccination, pay guest horse fee, office fee plus either stabling or day parking. Guest horses **ARE NOT ALLOWED IN WARM UP ARENAS DURING COMPETITION HOURS**.

Incomplete Entries: All entries must include a \$20 refundable Incomplete Entry Fee. Fee will be refunded for all entries completed by Friday, September 6th at 9:00 am. Entries completed later, but by Tuesday, September 10th at 9:00 am, will be refunded \$10 of the incomplete entry fee. *Complete entries include all required signatures, Coggins, vaccinations, music, membership requirements, and payment.* Entries with any open issues listed in pre-show notifications are incomplete; only entries that clear all unresolved entry issues by the times above qualify for the full or partial refund of the incomplete entry fee.

Rules Governing the Col. Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championships Finals

- 1. The same tests used to qualify will be used in the Finals, except the FEI Pony, Junior & Young Rider tests.
- 2. The tests must be ridden from memory and without whips.
- 3. No horse/rider team may ride Hors de Concours in a Finals class.
- 4. Entries for the Finals classes must be sent on the current Official Entry Blank to the current year's Finals Entry Secretary, Suzie Redick.
- 5. A horse/rider team may qualify at more than one level and all qualified horse/rider teams are permitted to compete in the Finals in consecutive qualified levels; this includes the corresponding Musical Freestyle finals.
- 6. Only ONE horse/rider combination may show in the Finals. If two riders qualify the same horse at different levels, the choice must be made and only one Finals horse/rider combination will be accepted by the Finals Show Secretary.
- 7. During the Finals competition, no horse entered in a Ljungquist Final may be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Final on that horse until that combination has finished their Finals class(es); this includes the awards ceremony. (At this point, the horse/rider combination may compete in open classes with new entry form and bridle number.)
- 8. Training Level and the First Level Finals for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above Third Level at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above Third Level at an USEF licensed show.
- 9. Second through Third Levels for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show.
- 10. Fourth Level for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at an USEF licensed show.
- 11. Prix St Georges for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II and/or B at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II and/or B at an USEF licensed show.

Awards Ceremony

Riders placing in Col. Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies (Ten places for Training & First (excluding MFS), eight places for all the rest of the Championship classes). Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, in consultation with the Technical Delegate, the Awards Coordinator, to be present and properly attired will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. In the case of inclement weather, unmounted ceremonies may be held.

 - Separate finals classes are offered for Junior Riders at Training and First levels. Young Riders must compete in the appropriate Senior division at Training and First levels. Junior/Young Riders are offered together at Second through Fourth levels (excluding Freestyles). If there are 3 or more Junior/ Young Riders at any of the FEI levels (excluding Freestyles), Junior/Young Riders will be pinned by division for the corresponding level(s).
- **High Score Award**: Training-Fourth Levels, FEI Levels combined

- **Trainer Award:** Highest average score trainer plus 2-5 students, ex Equitation, Materiale, & YH tests, inclusive of Freestyle and Intro (Fri and Sat scores only). Trainer may compete on up to 3 horses. Sign up at awards table.
- **Old Horse High Score Award:** High Score for horses over 20, excluding DSE, MFS, Materiale and YH tests. Sign up at awards table. Sponsored by Ali Perkins Dressage.
- NCDCTA Pony and Small Horse Champions Series: High Score Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr/Yr for Pony and Small Horse Under Saddle. Pony must be entered in Pony TOC class. Small horse defined as less than 16hh with shoes. Measurement documentation required, measurements for Ponies Only available at show. See ncdcta.org for full series details and measurement forms, sign up at awards table by 8am Sunday 9/15. Series championships to be held at Autumn Leaves Dressage 11/3/2024.
- **National Dressage Pony Cup High Score Award:** High Point and Reserve awards to the highest scoring pony in any class except Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests. Only ponies with valid USEF measurement certificates submitted to the show secretary will be eligible.
- **TIP Awards:** The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) is offering a high score ribbon for Thoroughbreds. Eligible horses must provide T.I.P. Numbers to the event secretary with entry. For more information, visit www.tjctip.com. All classes count except Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle, Intro & YH tests.
- **Dressage High Score Hanoverian:** Sponsored by AHS. No AHS membership required. All levels eligible, excluding Intro, Equitation, Materiale, Freestyle & YH tests. Winner receives neck sash.

- **Stock Horse High Score**: Sponsored by EZIUM Highest scoring registered Stock Horse (Quarter Horses, Appaloosas, and Paints). Excludes Equitation, Materiale, FS, Intro & YH tests. Friday and Saturday scores only.

USEF Rule DR129.9: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, © USEF 2022 DR -59 a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Introductory, Novice, Team, Individual) at the rider's classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Late Entries: Late entries may be accepted after the closing date if space is available, upon payment of an additional late entry fee of \$50. All late entries must enter and pay online – email for late entry permission.

Policy for Class Changes and Filling Scratches in classes: Must be eligible for class. Must have previously entered in competition as a competing or non-competing horse.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests are normally run in the size arena specified on the test, but PE tests that specify a 20m x 40m arena may be run in a large arena if USEF rules allow.

Day Trailer parking: Pay per day parking fee and park in areas designated by show management.

Musical Freestyles: must be provided in digital .mp3 or .wav format and uploaded to your entry or emailed to info@horseshowoffice.com. If emailed, include show name, horse name, rider name, and freestyle level in email. Please provide music at time of entry if possible; music must be received at least two hours prior to the start of the class. Sound check will be on Friday evening or early Saturday morning, check with show office. Competitor is responsible for attending sound check to make sure music works properly and for picking up their music at the end of the show.

Post entries and changes are accepted, if scheduling permits, at \$10 plus normal fee per class. Fee for horse and/or rider change is \$25; per-class \$10 change fee applies to horse/rider changes only if classes are also changed.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being walked, exercised or ridden.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to USEF Program classes. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

Entry Information (cont'd):

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. <u>DO NOT SEND</u> copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, or HIDs. If you do not know your numbers at time of entry, send just the numbers as soon as possible after you enter. Memberships should not be renewed directly with USEF or USDF after Monday before the show as verification may not be available in time for the show. Renewals done at the show are effective as of the start of the show.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means Official Qualifying Class for the 2024 Great American/USDF Regional Championships. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, Jr-YR, or Pony and pay additional \$15 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts: It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

Additional Stabling Information:

- **Stable Group:** Please list stable group on entry form and use only **one group name** for each stable group to ensure that your group will be stabled together.
- Stalls will be ready to use by 11:00 am on Thursday
- Any stall changes MUST be cleared with show office.
- Trailer-ins must pay daily grounds fee and park in designated areas.
- No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced, or remove them from the showgrounds without permission of the show secretary or show manager.
- Lungeing in designated areas only.

Pets: Dogs **must be on leashes or otherwise restrained AT ALL TIMES** while on show grounds, including in the stable area and NO pets are allowed inside coliseum. Dog owners are soley responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dogs should not be kenneled overnight in the stable area. Dog owners failing to comply will be issued a Yellow warning card and non-compliance may result in further USEF penalties.

About Col. Bengt Ljungquist (USDF)



Colonel Bengt Ljungquist devoted a decade to furthering dressage in the United States. He developed a judges' training program that continues today and conducted the first organized forums, which gathered together the day's most learned trainers and aspiring judges. His dedication to and leadership in the pursuit of excellence in dressage in the U.S. was recognized by his induction into the USDF Hall of Fame in 1998.

Born into a Swedish military family in Sweden, Ljungquist continued the family tradition by joining the Swedish Army after he completed secondary school. In 1934 he received his cavalry commission, which he later resigned, along with many of his brethren officers, during the Finnish-Soviet Winter War to join the Finns and defend their country.

After the Finnish Soviet Winter War (1939-1940) he returned to Sweden and its army, where he studied and had a tour of duty as an instructor at the Military Academy at Karlberg. Ljungquist's military career included being sent to Ethiopia as part of the Swedish Military Mission to help establish a cadet school and to train Imperial Guards. He was also commander of the Swedish cavalry cadet school. In 1955, he was promoted to commander of the Royal Horse Guards and stationed in Stockholm. As part of his military duties, Ljungquist organized the equestrian competition at the 1956 Stockholm Olympic Games.

An avid lifelong equestrian, Ljungquist began riding at the age of ten. An active national and international dressage competitor throughout his military career, he won the Swedish Dressage Championship six times. He was the team reserve rider for the 1960 Rome Games and represented his country at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics, aboard Karat. was even more famous in international circles as a fencer than as an equestrian. He was a reserve world fencing champion who competed on several Swedish Olympic fencing teams.

When the cavalry was mechanized, Ljungquist began a career as a civilian dressage trainer and instructor. During a visit with his sister at the 1968 Mexico City Olympics, he made a trip to the U.S. that sparked his interest in furthering dressage in the States. In 1969, he was invited to teach dressage at the Foxcroft School in Virginia. On that same trip, he gave a clinic at Lake Erie (OH) College Equestrian Center. That involvement led to other lessons and clinics, and 1978-9, he began training out of future "O" judge Linda Zang's Idlewilde Farm in Davidsonville, MD also visiting Meredith Manor in West Virginia. Numerous notable dressage riders made the trip to Idlewilde to study with Ljungquist, who later became the U.S. dressage-team coach, a position he held from 1974 to 1978. In 1974, he brought the U.S. squad to the attention of the European dressage community when he coached World Championships competitors Elizabeth Lewis on Ludmilla, Edith Master on Dahlwitz, John Winnett on Leopardi, and Sidley Payne on Felix. Then in 1975, the U.S. team returned home from the Pan-American Games in Mexico with a team gold medal, as well as an individual silver for Hilda Gurney and Keen, an individual bronze for Dorothy Morkis and Monaco, and a fourth-place individual finish for John Winnett and Leopardi placed fourth. To cap off his international coaching accomplishments, Ljungquist guided the U.S. dressage squad to a team bronze medal at the 1976 Montreal Olympic Games.

An advocate for dressage-judge education, Ljungquist helped to develop a training program for the Potomac Valley Dressage Association. The PVDA program became the model for most judges' training programs in the U.S. In 1976 Ljungquist published his Practical Dressage Manual, which today remains a modern equestrian classic.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS -HEADGEAR RULE FOR DRESSAGE

Protective headgear –DR120.6 (GR801.6) From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such head-gear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tail coat_(only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must other-wise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

US Equestrian Federation General Rules and Regulations

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The 2024 Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championships Rules

Qualifying dates: September 19, 2023 - September 1, 2024

Method:

Horse/rider teams qualify by riding in designated CBLM qualifying classes at participating competitions. Qualified horse/rider teams will then compete at the Finals.

Awards:

Prize money for places 1-3. At Training and First Levels (excluding Freestyles), ribbons for places 1-10. For all other levels, ribbons for places 1-8. Separate Finals classes will be held for Junior riders at Training, First, Second USEF levels; Junior/Young riders at Third & Fourth USEF levels (excluding freestyles). Young Riders must compete in the appropriate Senior division at Training, First, Second USEF Levels. If there are 3 or more Junior/Young riders at any FEI levels (excluding Freestyles), a separate Finals class will be held for the corresponding level(s).

Qualifying rules:

- 1. A horse/rider team qualifies as a team, and only the same team may compete at the Finals.
- 2. The rider must be a member of a participating USDF GMO dressage association at the time of qualification.
- 3. To be eligible to compete in the Finals in a given level, the *horse* must not have been shown before Sept 13, 2024 in any test two levels above that level in shows licensed by the USEF, the FEI or any other National Federation. Exception: Riders who have never shown two levels above their Finals level may ride experienced horses. **Only the USDF HID # is required.**
- 4. The rider is responsible for submitting a form as proof of qualification to the Championships Secretary as soon as possible after the qualifying ride. (Qualification Form available on www.CBLM.org and from Bettina Longaker, email address on following page).

 Please include your email address. No rider will qualify until the Secretary receives a properly filled-out qualification form. The Secretary will confirm qualification by a qualification list on the official CBLM website. Only riders who have NOT qualified will be individually notified.
- 5. Competitions may **not** charge extra fees for qualifying rides.
- 6. ANY class offered that is a CBLM test will be designated as a qualifying class.
- 7. Over a period of four days or less, no more than two qualifying competitions may be held at the same location.
- 8. Winning horse/rider teams at the Finals will be ineligible to compete at the same level in succeeding years, except for Intermediate II, Grand Prix, Grand Prix Freestyle and Pas de Deux.
- 9. The 2024 Finals classes may be used to qualify for 2025 and the FS and FEI Finals may be used to qualify for the USDF/GAIG Finals (except Training level F.S) for 2025.
- 10. The last date to qualify forthe 2023 Finals is September 19, 2023

Qualification Requirements:

CBLM Age for all Levels: is determined by the age of the rider as of $\underline{December 1}$: Children = 12 - 14; Junior = 18 & under; Young Rider = 19 - 21; Senior = 22 and older.

Freestyles: The Qualifying score is 63%. At the Finals, there will be seven freestyles. 1) Training Level; 2) First Level; 3) Second Level*; 4) Third Level**; 5) Fourth Level****; 6) Intermediate I; 7) Grand Prix. Any type of freestyle class from a USEF licensed competition will be accepted, including GAIG/USDF qualifying classes, USDF or FEI freestyles, or CDI freestyles.

Pas de Deux: The Qualifying score is 65%.

- * FEI Children or Pony Team/FS Tests may be ridden by Children/Juniors to qualify at 2nd level; they will ride 2nd Level Test 2 & 2nd FS in the Finals
- ** FEI Junior Team/FS Tests may be ridden by Juniors to qualify at 3rd level; they will ride 3rd Level Test 2 & 3rd FS in the Finals *** FEI Young Rider Team test may be ridden by eligible Young riders respectively to qualify at PSG; they will ride PSG in the
- Finals

 **** FEI Young Rider Freestyle may be ridden by eligible Young Riders to qualify for 4th Level MFS; they will ride 4th MFS in the

CBLM Age is determined by the age of the rider as of December 1: Children = 12 - 14; Junior = 18 & under; Young Rider = 19 - 21 years.

Rules Governing the Finals

- 1. The same tests used to qualify will be used in the Finals, except the FEI Children Pony, Junior & Young Rider tests listed above.
- 2. The tests must be ridden from memory and without whips.
- 3. No horse/rider team may ride Hors de Concours in a Finals class.
- 4. Entries for the Finals classes may be made online (www.horseshowoffice.com) or mailed (received by the closing date) to the current year's Finals Entry Secretary, **Suzie Redick** along with all payments and necessary documents.
- 5. A horse/rider team may qualify at more than one level and all qualified horse/rider teams are permitted to compete in the Finals in consecutive qualified levels; this includes the corresponding Freestyle finals.
- 6. Only ONE horse/rider combination may show in the Finals. If two riders qualify the same horse at different levels, the choice must be made and only one Finals horse/rider combination will be accepted by the Finals Show Secretary(exception: Pas de Deux).
- 7. During the Finals competition, no horse entered in a Ljungquist Final may be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Final on that horse until that combination has finished their Finals class(es); this includes the awards ceremony. (At this point, the new horse/rider combination may compete in open classes with new entry form and bridle number.)
- 8. Training Level and First Level Finals for Senior/YR riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at or above Third Level at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who **have** competed at or above Third Level at an USEF licensed show.
- 9. Second and Third Level Finals for senior (and/or YR) riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who <u>have not</u> competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who <u>have</u> competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show.
- 10. Fourth Level Finals for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who <u>have not</u> competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who <u>have</u> competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at an USEF licensed show.
- 11. Prix St Georges Finals for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who **have not** competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who **have** competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II and/or B at an USEF licensed show.
- 12. A Division A rider may compete in Division B, but a Division B rider may NOT compete in Division A.
- 13. Regardless of the Division entered, only **ONE Level** per entrant (A or B, not both) may be ridden in at the Championships.
- 14. The Pas de Deux Finals class MUST be held on Sunday of the Finals Competition.
- 15. Finalists are NOT required to be stabled on grounds.
- 16. The Championship competition is to be held within USDF Region 1 only.

For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2024

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2024 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.
